



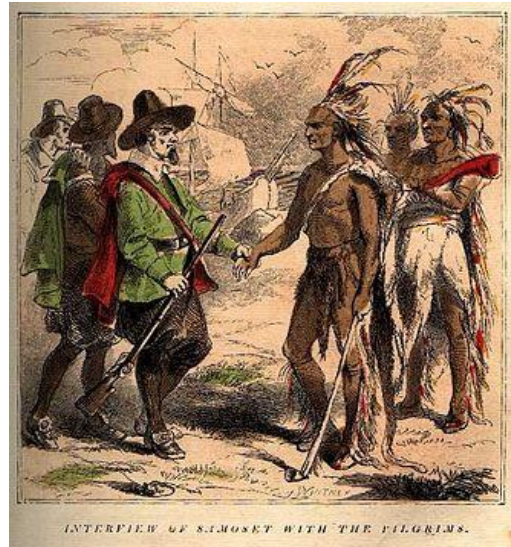
A Clash of Cultures Post-Thanksgiving Walking Tour
