

Shipwreck Emerges on Hull Beach

A Hull resident walking along Nantasket Beach during low tide last week noticed parts of a wooden ship poking out from the sand.

Working with the Hull Lifesaving Museum, and Victor Mastone, Chief Archaeologist of the MA Board of Underwater Archaeological Resources volunteers excavated around the edges of the shipwreck. Preliminary information suggests the ship was a schooner, ranging in length from 75 to 120 feet.
